FAMILY STORY

For the Oumar and Fatou, the difficulties and struggles they have faced over the past years are insignificant compared to the joy and hopeful days they have ahead. One day soon, the family will have a brand new home with enough space for their two young boys to run and to play. And one day soon, the couple will be reunited with their two older sons who remained living in Africa when they moved to America.

Years ago, Oumar and Fatou — refugees of Guinea, Africa and parents of four strikingly handsome boys — were granted asylum to leave their dangerous and unstable surroundings in Guinea and move to the United State. They sought a safer and better life for

their children, and they knew America would provide them with the best opportunities for their sons to succeed in life. Sadly however, their sons were not granted Visas to move with them, and since have lived with their grandparents in Mali — a much safer alternative to Guinea.

When speaking to the family, you cannot help but see the loneliness and anguish this separation has caused them. But despite that, the family remains hopeful. Oumar and Fatou talk to their sons multiple times each week, keeping up with their boys' school activities and their growing lives.

It's evident the parents miss their 13- and 15-year-old sons, but instead of focusing on those feelings they choose to look towards the future. They look towards the one day when the entire family will be reunited all under one roof. Oumar said his two sons are in the queue to receive Visas and move to America; now the family waits.

"It's very hard," Fatou said when speaking about her sons still living in Africa. "But if we bring them here they'll have a better life," Oumar added.

The teenagers will be rejoined with their mother and father, whom they haven't seen in over five years. They'll meet their two younger brothers for the very first time. And they'll become one family again, living under one roof – in a safe and decent four-bedroom home that will be built by Iowa Valley Habitat for Humanity volunteers and supporters this summer.

About the Diallo family

In 2002, Oumar Diallo moved from his home country of Guinea to New York City. His country was unsafe with constant fighting, riots, arrests and murders. Oumar wanted to better his wife and children's lives and knew moving to America would provide them with abundant opportunities.

"My country is very tough," he said. "You think, 'Maybe someday they'll kill you. Maybe someday they'll rob you. You don't know.'"

Within six months of coming to the United State, Oumar moved to Iowa City to seek job opportunities while living with an acquaintance. His wife, Fatou, joined him just a year later to plant their household in the Iowa City area. The couple currently lives in the Bon-Aire Mobile Home Lodge with their two youngest sons, six-year-old Amadou and three-year-old Esoumaila.

The ALPLA employee said he's looking forward to a new home to call their own. He wants his children to have more room to play and to be safe and comfortable. He wants his children to be warm at night and safe during storms and high winds. Their current mobile home lacks the sturdy structure that it needs, and he'll finally be able to sleep peacefully at night knowing his family is safe and out of harm's way.

VOLUNTEER SCHEDULE

Your group can get out on a build site and work together to help build the Room for All Build! We rely on community involvement to help us build Habitat homes and help us fund them along the way. The Room for All Build will cost IVHFH around \$110,000 to build (including the lot purchase, building materials and professional labor we are required to hire in). We highly encourage participating groups to bring with them a suggested donation of \$5-10 per volunteer to support the house they will have a hand in building. To help you in this process, we've included a list of in-house fundraising ideas on the following page.

There is currently an overwhelming response from groups and individuals in the community wanting to volunteer on the Room for All Build, so please contact us today (kasie@iowavalleyhabitat.org or 319.337.8949) to secure your group's spot. All opportunities are on a first-come, first-served basis.

How to read the Volunteer Schedule:

- Volunteer days are held most Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays starting in late June.
- All build days have two shifts: 8 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-5 p.m. Your group can reserve a morning shift, afternoon shift or both for any of the given Volunteer Dates listed below.
- All volunteers must be 16 or older to work on the construction site. Construction shifts that can accommodate younger volunteers are marked with a cross (†).

Tasks are subject to change depending on weather and work pace.

VOLUNTEER DATES

MAX # VOLUNTEERS/SHIFT

JUNE 24-26 (2 open shifts)

Framing..... 15-20 volunteers

*June 24th morning & afternoon shifts reserved for Waterfront Hy-Vee

*June 26th morning & afternoon shifts reserved for St. Andrew Presbyterian

Walls are raised into place to form the "skeleton" of the house. Other tasks include raising the trusses and decking the roof. This is one of the most exciting volunteer experiences, because you get to see the house take form. Tools you will be using include hammers, nails, saws, levels, and ladders.

JULY 1-2 (4 open shifts)

Framing (roofing)..... 15-20 volunteers

Tasks include hanging the trusses, installing rakes and sub fascia, building bird boxes for the home, and sheathing the roof, doors, and windows. Tools you will be using include hammers, nails, saws, levels, and ladders.

JULY 15-17 (4 open shifts)

Finish Framing (roofing/porch/blocking).....15-20 volunteers

*July 17 morning shift reserved for Precision Revenue

*July 17 afternoon shift reserved for Vineyard Church

Tasks will include shingling the roof, installing Hurricane straps, insulation backing, and installing rigid foam.

JULY 22-24 (6 open shifts)

Wrap house (Porch).....15-20 volunteers

Tasks will include interior framing, installing the porch, installing the windows & door bucks, and wrapping the house. Wrapping the house consists of stapling Ty-Vek to the walls of the home and is a very important step because it helps keep water out and it protects the OSB board, extending the life of the house.

JULY 29-31 (6 open shifts)

Set Windows & Doors.....6-14 volunteers

Volunteers will install windows, doors, trim backers at gable ends, and Azek trim.

†AUGUST 5-7 (6 open shifts)

Siding, Soffit, Facia.....15-20 volunteers

Volunteers can be as young as 15 to participate in siding.

Siding is installed by nailing individual pieces of vinyl siding to the exterior of the house. This will include installing the various channels, soffit and facia. Tools used are hammers, utility knives, siding nails, saws, ladders, and gloves. This activity is great because you are completing the outside look of the home.

†AUGUST 12-14 (6 open shifts)

Siding, Soffit, Facia15-20 volunteers

Volunteers can be as young as 15 to participate in siding.

†AUGUST 26-28 (6 open shifts)

Paint/Stain..... 10-15 volunteers

**Volunteers as young as 14 can help paint and stain.*

This is the most visible aspect of volunteer work. Tasks include priming and painting the interior of the home, and painting/staining the doors and trim. Tools include paint brushes, rollers, pans, drop clothes, and ladders.

SEPTEMBER 2-4 (6 open shifts)

Cabinet/Closet installation/Trim..... 8-12 volunteers

Volunteers will install cabinets, counter tops, interior doors, window stools, bath vanity, and towel bars.

†SEPTEMBER 9-11 (6 open shifts)

Landscaping/Trim Carpentry..... 15-20 volunteers

- **†Volunteers as young as 10 can help landscape.** Landscaping consists of either laying sod or planting grass. Volunteers may also assist in digging holes for trees, planting flowers, and watering the yard. Tools include rakes and gloves.
- Trim is measuring the walls, using power tools to cut trim to size and gluing or stapling the trim to the wall. Volunteers must be 18 or older to participate in this activity.

†SEPTEMBER 16 (2 open shifts)

Clean & Final Punch..... 5-10 volunteers

**Volunteers as young as 10 can help clean and prepare the house for dedication.*

Includes all of the last minute tasks necessary to complete a home, including but not limited to tool pick-up and cleaning, window cleaning, paint spot removal, touch-up painting, and setting up for dedication.

Ways for All Ages

Room for All Build is designed to involve a range of ages, skill levels, backgrounds, talents and beliefs by bringing people together from all spectrums of life. To this end, we are making it as easy as possible to get your members involved in volunteering and supporting the Diallos into a safe and secure home.

Thank you in advance for partnering with our affiliate to help us build a home for Oumar & Fatou Diallo and their four children. We appreciate your assistance and thank you for understanding that it takes many hands, many hearts, and many gifts to build a Habitat home.

Aside from gathering donations, there are many ways your group can get creative to raise funds to support Iowa Valley Habitat for Humanity.

Food-themed events

- Bake sale/Cookie walk: Gather goodies to sell and raise funds!
- Hold a chili/grill cook-off or cake-baking/cookie-decorating competition: Charge a small entry fee at the door to receive all the samples the attendee's heart desires!
- Ice Cream Social: Get some ice cream and charge people \$5 for all-you-can-eat sundaes.
- Spaghetti Dinner: Charge \$5 for all-you-can-eat spaghetti dinner.
- Craft sale: Ask individuals to donate quilts, children-created crafts, stepping stones, etc. and auction off the items.
- Cold Meat Croissant/Sub or Pizza Sales: Take orders for the food and then select a day for your group to assemble them.

Drives

- Popcan Drive: Ask individuals to donate redeemable aluminum cans and pop bottles, then sort them and drop them off at Can Shed for redemption.
- Clothing Drive: Have individuals drop off their clothing/gently used items on a designated day, and then host a garage sale or take the items to a consignment shop.
- Change Drive: Collect change from your pockets and purses! You can even have a challenge within your group or against another group.
- Service Drive: Canvas a neighborhood with fliers telling them you'll be offering to complete light household and outdoor tasks in exchange for a donation to Habitat.

Special events

- Silent Talent Auction: Use your individuals' talents and gifts! Ask them to donate a talent or service (cooking classes, cake-baking classes, tutoring sessions, piano lessons, a week's worth of meals) and hold a silent auction.
- "Go Without" day: Encourage everyone within your group to go without something they wouldn't normally go without for an entire day: coffee, pop, movie, dinner out, night out on the town, etc. To recognize their efforts, have each participant fill out a pledge card to show what they decided to "Go Without."
 - Give a Dollar: Ask each person in your group and each person they encounter on a declared day to give \$1.
